Mary Laura,

Thank you for sending the draft outline for the Ready to Read, Ready to Learn" early childhood education summit on October 1st. Mrs. Bush is looking forward to her trip to Florida.

Clearly, Florida has a number of high-quality early childhood programs and we are familiar with the excellent research work done by Dr. Chris Lonigan. However, I'd like to suggest a few changes to the program that will help capture and highlight both Florida's model programs and Mrs. Bush's "Ready to Read, Ready to Learn" initiative.

The "signature" feature of Mrs. Bush's early childhood initiative is its strong focus on using the best research available to help prepare children for success in school. At the request of a number of states, Mrs. Bush has hosted several regional summits that model her July, 2001 White House Conference on Early Childhood Cognitive Development. At each summit, a number of the nation's leading experts shared their latest research and its implications for ensuring children have the pre-reading and vocabulary skills that are essential to learning to read. Mrs. Bush would like to include some of that same content in this event.

Below is a suggested program outline that I think combines both of our goals. It includes opportunities for sharing the latest research on how best to develop

children's cognitive skills and, highlights Florida's model programs that use proven methods to ensure children are 'ready to read and ready to learn'.
