
Dear Mr. Sidio:

The Federal Election Commission reviewed the allegations in your complaint received on January 28, 2011. On December 13, 2011, based upon the information provided in the complaint, and information provided by the respondent, the Commission determined that there was no reason to believe the respondent violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. Therefore, the Commission decided to close its file in this matter on December 13, 2011.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. See Statement of Policy Regarding Disclosure of Closed Enforcement and Related Files, 68 Fed. Reg. 70,426 (Dec. 18, 2003). A copy of the dispositive General Counsel's Report is enclosed for your information. The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action. See 2 U.S.C. § 437g (a)(8).


